

Attendance

- Regular attendance at school is essential for all children to achieve in the short and long term.
- Good attendance is not just about learning but about social skills.
- Children who miss a lot of school can often become anxious about attending because they worry that they will not be able to keep up or not be sure about what is happening in class.
- The DfE definition of acceptable attendance is 96% a child with 96% attendance will have missed 7.5 days of school.





 Children whose attendance is below 90% are classed as persistent absentees. Any child whose attendance falls below 90% will be placed on an attendance support plan until their attendance improves.
