### **Hull Fair Top Tips Safety Advice**

- Don't go alone, children and young people must always go with a responsible adult.
- Take a photo of children before you set off so if you become separated you can quickly show a police officer what they look like and what they are wearing.
- Give your child your contact details, preferably with a mobile telephone number. Carrying these contact details will enable any
  child who becomes lost, to be reunited quickly. Make sure your child knows who to go to if they get lost, point out Police
  officers and Police Community Support Officers.
- Leave any valuables at home, only take with you what you absolutely need and remember to lock all windows and doors before you set off.
- Consider wearing clothes that have pockets with zips or using a money belt to keep your property safe. Only take the amount of money you will need and are willing to spend.
- If you see anything suspicious report it immediately to a Police Officer, Police Community Support Officer, Stewards or Fairground Staff.
- Have a pre-arranged meeting place to go to in the event of you becoming separated from friends/relatives.


#### Thank you

- Regular attendance at school is essential for all children to achieve in the short and long term.
- Good attendance is not just about learning but about social skills.
- The DfE definition of acceptable attendance is 96% a child with 96% attendance will have missed 7.5 days of school.
- Children whose attendance is below 90% are classed as persistent absentees. Any child whose attendance falls below 90% will be placed on an attendance support plan until their attendance improves.
