A - F	To provide 60 additional Chromebooks	Boost progress in basic skills through use of Lexia, Mathletics, Times Table Rock Stars. Improved take up of home learning in the event of bubble closure leading to reduced learning gaps.	Additional Chromebooks will allow for greater numbers of children in KS2 with gaps in phonics, reading and writing to access regular Lexia sessions which supports the narrowing of those gaps. Progress can be monitored by classteacher and SEN team. In maths teachers can set targeted work for groups on Mathletics - the programme provides additional challenge for children who are succeeding and support for those struggling. Progress can be monitored by classteacher. Will be used as part of wider system of support. We will be able to develop children's skills in using Google Classrooms so that in the event of a bubble closure or further lockdown they will be able to access online learning. A &B	To provide Reading Recovery support in KS1 and FFT training for support staff	Boost progress in reading for lowest attaining readers	Reading Recovery is a proven intervention which accelerates reading and writing progress through 1:1 half hour intensive sessions. In addition to work carried out in school children have daily take home tasks which support learning and encourage family involvement in learning. In addition to this the Reading Recovery teacher will train TAs in Years 1, 2 and 3 in Fisher Family Trust Wave 3 intervention. This follows a similar format to the Reading Recovery sessions and will allow us to extend the number of children supported and ensure sustainability.	Drop ins Assessment of children's reading. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

• A great deal of emotional well-being support is provided through systems already available in school (Emotional Well-being Practitioner and Jigsaw PSHE). In addition to this all staff are mindful of the levels of stress that children have been through during the last year and are ensuring that any academic catch up does not increase that stress. We know that children who feel safe, happy and stress-free are the most effective learners and we are focusing on providing an environment and curriculum that enables this for all our children.
